

# The road to a Final Investment Decision

Marinus Link's shareholders, the Commonwealth, Tasmania and Victoria, have made a Final Investment Decision to proceed with Stage 1 of Marinus Link.

This timeline details the major milestones and significant work leading up to this decision.

It also shows the key next steps before construction commences, expected in 2026.

#### **Economic assessment**

- 2017: "Tamblyn Report" recommends further investigation into a second Bass Strait interconnector
- 2019: Initial Feasibility Report and Business
   Case Assessment conclude that a second interconnector is technically and economically viable
- 2018 2021: TasNetworks undertakes
  the Regulatory Investment Test (RIT-T) for
  Transmission process, finding that the benefits
  of a 1500 MW staged interconnector project
  significantly outweigh the costs
- 2024: RIT-T Update published with new market modelling and updated project costs confirms Marinus Link's benefits remain net positive
- 2025: Second RIT-T Update draws on AEMO's latest input assumptions and future scenarios data and a refined project cost, finding improved market and consumer benefits

## **Regulatory process**

- 2023: Marinus Link Pty Ltd formally begins a revenue determination process with the Australian Energy Regulator (AER)
- 2023: AER approves Marinus Link's Part A revenue proposal, marking the project's 'early works' spending as prudent and efficient
- 2024: Marinus Link submits its Part B Revenue Proposal to the AER, with market-tested costs for cables and converter stations
- 2025: Marinus Link submits its revised Part B Revenue Proposal to the AER, with markettested costs for civil and construction works
- 2025: Second RIT-T Update draws on AEMO's latest input assumptions and future scenarios data and a refined project cost, finding improved market and consumer benefits

# **Environment and planning approvals**

- 2020–2025: Environmental marine and field studies and surveys conducted
- 2021: Commonwealth and Victorian environmental referrals submitted
- 2022: Tasmanian environmental referral submitted
- 2022: Guidance and scoping requirements for the environmental impact assessment documentation issued by regulatory authorities
- 2024: Combined EIS/EES and Draft Victorian PSA submitted to the Australian and Victorian governments and placed on public exhibition
- 2024 2025: Tasmanian EISs and DA submitted to the Tasmanian government and placed on public exhibition
- **2025**: Decision made under Victorian legislation
- 2025\*: Decisions made under Commonwealth and Tasmanian legislation

## Ownership & funding

- 2020: Agreement signed between Tasmania and the Commonwealth to formalise financial support and take the project through design & approvals
- 2022: Joint ownership and equity funding model agreed by the Commonwealth, Tasmania and Victoria
- **2024**: Three-part ownership model established
- 2025\*: Debt financing arrangements finalised with the Clean Energy Finance Corporation
